##### **The Rev. Terence Blackburn – St. Luke’s Church, Roselle and Grace Church, Linden**

Father Blackburn oversaw the joining of two small parishes in Roselle and Linden, which remain independent, but share the services of one rector. He would bring to the Standing Committee an understanding of unique problems facing the smaller parishes. He has been in the Diocese of New Jersey for 11 years and in that time has served on the Board of Missions, the Finance and Budget Committee, the Liturgy Committee and the Clergy Compensation Commission.
