Jeanne Kerwin, MMH, MICP received her Masters in Medial Humanities at Drew University, New Jersey; her Certificate in Biomedical Ethics and Medical Humanities at Columbia University, New York; and her Bachelor of Science in Public Health at Rutgers University, New Jersey. She remains certified as a Mobile Intensive Care Paramedic in the State of New Jersey.

Ms. Kerwin is the Program Coordinator for Ethics and Palliative Care at Overlook Hospital in Summit, New Jersey. She was the Director of EMS for Atlantic Health System and a paramedic in the State of New Jersey. She is an instructor in Advanced Cardiac Life Support and Basic Life Support and was instrumental in the implementation of Public Access Defibrillation programs in New Jersey. She worked to bring the issues of bioethics and humanity in medicine into the practice of emergency medicine.

Ms. Kerwin has published a number of articles about ethics in EMS, Advance Directives, Bioethics Committees and patients' rights, and developed an educational program to teach EMS providers about medical ethics and humanity in EMS.
